

### **Vita for Raymond Slade, Jr.**

Raymond M. Slade, Jr. served as a Hydrologist for 33 years with the U.S. Geological Survey in Texas until he retired about 7 years ago. He has authored more than 100 reports concerning Texas water resources, with topics including the Edwards aquifer, floods, droughts, rural and urban hydrology, and water quality of surface and ground water.

Raymond has served on theses and dissertation committees for many students and as guest lecturer on water resources at several Texas universities. He has prepared many talks and reports for local, statewide, and national conferences and conventions and represented the USGS at state and federal judicial and administrative proceedings. He also has served as a water-resources expert on technical and advisory committees for many federal, state and local agencies. Since his retirement from the USGS he has been an Adjunct Professor at Austin Community College, is a part-time Hydrogeologist with the Edwards Aquifer Research and Data Center at Texas State University, served as a volunteer for several water-resources related agencies, and been a self-employed Consulting Hydrologist. He is Certified and Registered as a Professional Hydrologist with the American Institute of Hydrology.
